

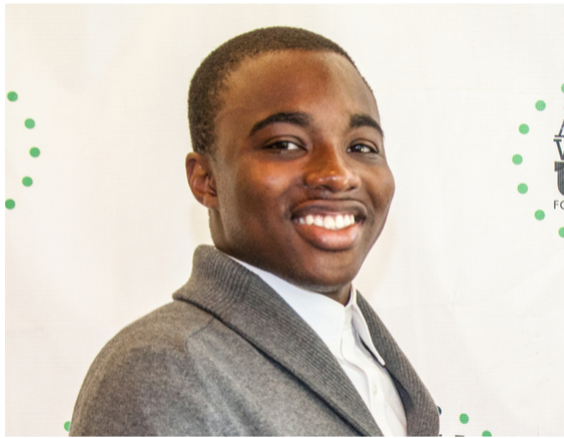


News from the All Ways Up Foundation



The 7th Annual All Ways Up Education Summit!

In June, the All Ways Up Foundation hosted the 7th annual UP Through Education Summit and welcomed 60 rising college freshmen from eleven different states to the All Ways Up family. The goal of the Summit is to help ease the transition to college, which can often be daunting for low-income and first generation students. During the week-long Summit, the students attended workshops and engaged in activities focused on self-care, time management, tips for academic success, financial literacy and building your personal brand. The students spent an afternoon in Temescal Canyon exploring the boundaries of trust on a ropes course and challenge course and bonded at the beach over In 'n Out burgers. While their journeys are just beginning, they are all heading to college with tools and resources to ensure college success. The students are all recipients of an All Ways Up college scholarship that is renewable while they are in college.
