2021 Bridging the Gap Awards

For the past 10 years, All Ways Up has been supporting small, grassroots non-profits that are providing college access and success programs to the students in their communities. Many of the organizations we support are invited to participate in a year-end matching campaign in which All Ways Up matches dollar for dollar (up to a specified amount) the funds raised. This year, our community partners raised nearly \$300,000 during the month-long campaign and All Ways Up has granted and matched funds totaling an

additional \$370,000!!! This investment in our community partners is one of the keys to achieving our mission of helping low-income and first-gen students get into and through college.



Job Skills Program

Beginning this month, we will once again partner with FutureMap to provide our juniors and seniors with a four-part program aimed at helping the scholars prepare for summer internships and for life after graduation. The program includes sessions on

networking, preparing your resume and cover letter, and interviewing. This year, we will offer the students the opportunity to practice their interview skills in a 20-minute session with friends and alumni of the Foundation.
